BEYOND CRISIS – THE FUTURE OF GLOBAL ORDER(S)

Against the background of the global financial crisis, a trend becomes visible which poses a new challenge for international politics: new multipolar power constellations and informal governance mechanisms are gaining influence. The G8 are increasingly replaced by the G20, horizontal governance mechanisms complement or replace the existing hierarchically organized structure of global governance. These new policy mechanisms facilitate global regulatory and structural policies in the absence of effective multilateral processes. However, multilateral structures are essential for a coherent approach and a legitimate framework.

Shortly after the G8 summit in Muskoka/Canada, the symposium wants to examine systematically these features of emerging new global orders from different perspectives. We will start with an analysis of power shifts which could be witnessed during the last decade and proceed to a critical review of existing global institutional structures and orders in issue areas like global finance and economy, security and development. We invite you to discuss these different aspects of new global orders in our international conference.
